



Attention High School Administrators, Career Center Directors, and Teachers:

RISE (Regional Innovation and Startup Education) has partnered with Ivy Tech Community College to provide training, curriculum, mentorship, and connectivity for dual credit high school entrepreneurship classrooms running the Next Level Programs of Study (NLPS) Entrepreneurship Pathway in the state of Indiana.

Thanks to the RISE program, applications are now available for dual credit high school entrepreneurship teachers to apply for training and support. This program is led by RISE and Ivy Tech Community College. Training funds will cover all program fees for 40 eligible high school teachers on a first come, first serve basis.

This summer, RISE will be hosting training sessions in South Bend, Columbus, and Indianapolis for educators across the state. Attending RISE training is a credentialing requirement for dual credit entrepreneurship through Ivy Tech.

Ivy Tech Community College supports RISE training and programming by offering training funds for schools running the Next Level Programs of Study Entrepreneurship Pathway for dual credit. This financial support will cover the full cost of training and subscription access for first-year RISE facilitators. Travel and food costs associated with the training are not included.

Even if your local high school will not be running the Entrepreneurship Pathway during the 2022-2023 school year, we still highly encourage you to send a teacher to training this summer to take advantage of this one-time funding. This will ensure that you have a credentialed teacher available when your high school or career center is ready to begin offering the pathway. This funding will only be available for teachers attending training in the summer of 2022.
