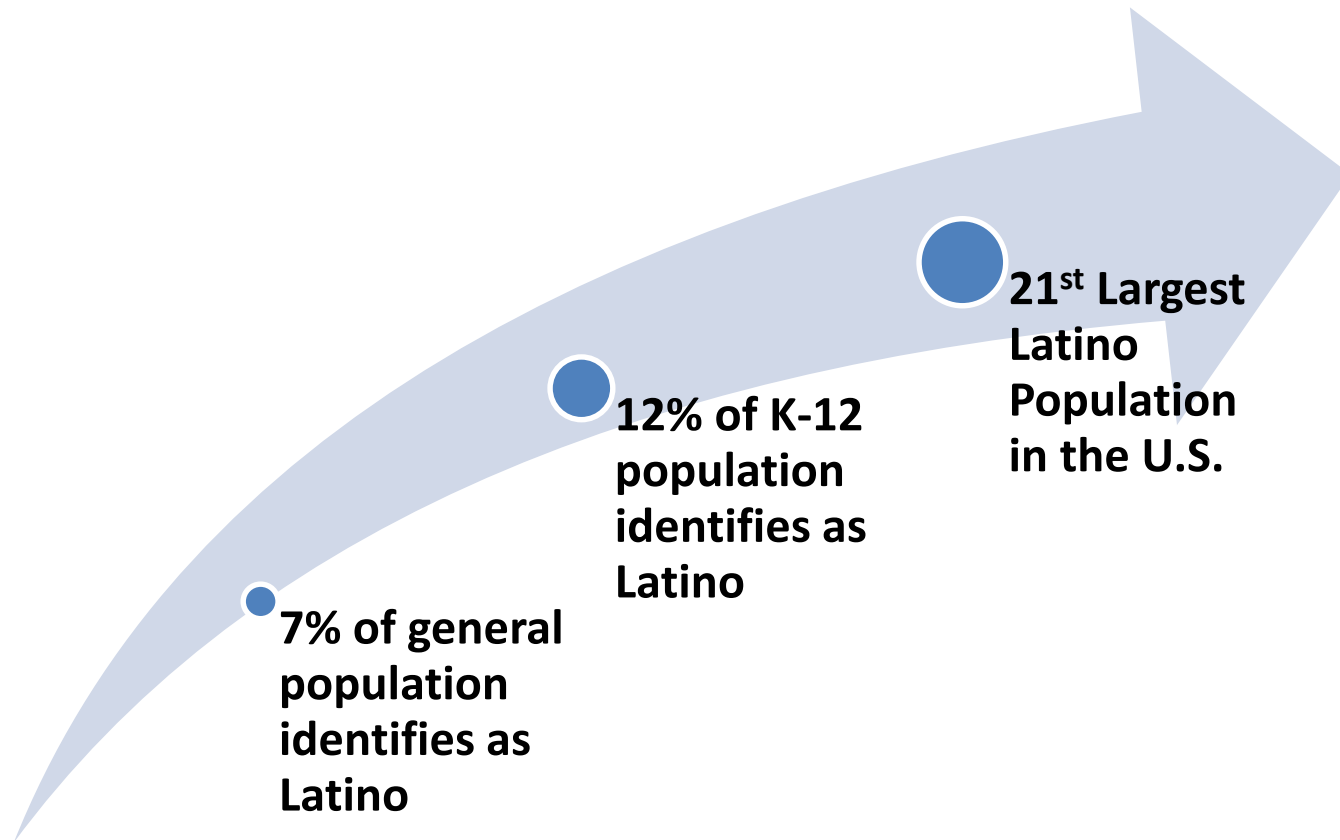
Justification

CHE has its “**Big Goal**” for 60 percent of Hoosiers to have an educational credential or training beyond high school.

Latino learners now make up 12% of our K-12 system and fewer than 15% of working age Latinos hold a college degree. To meet our **Big Goal**, we must work to effectively engage Latino students and their parents.

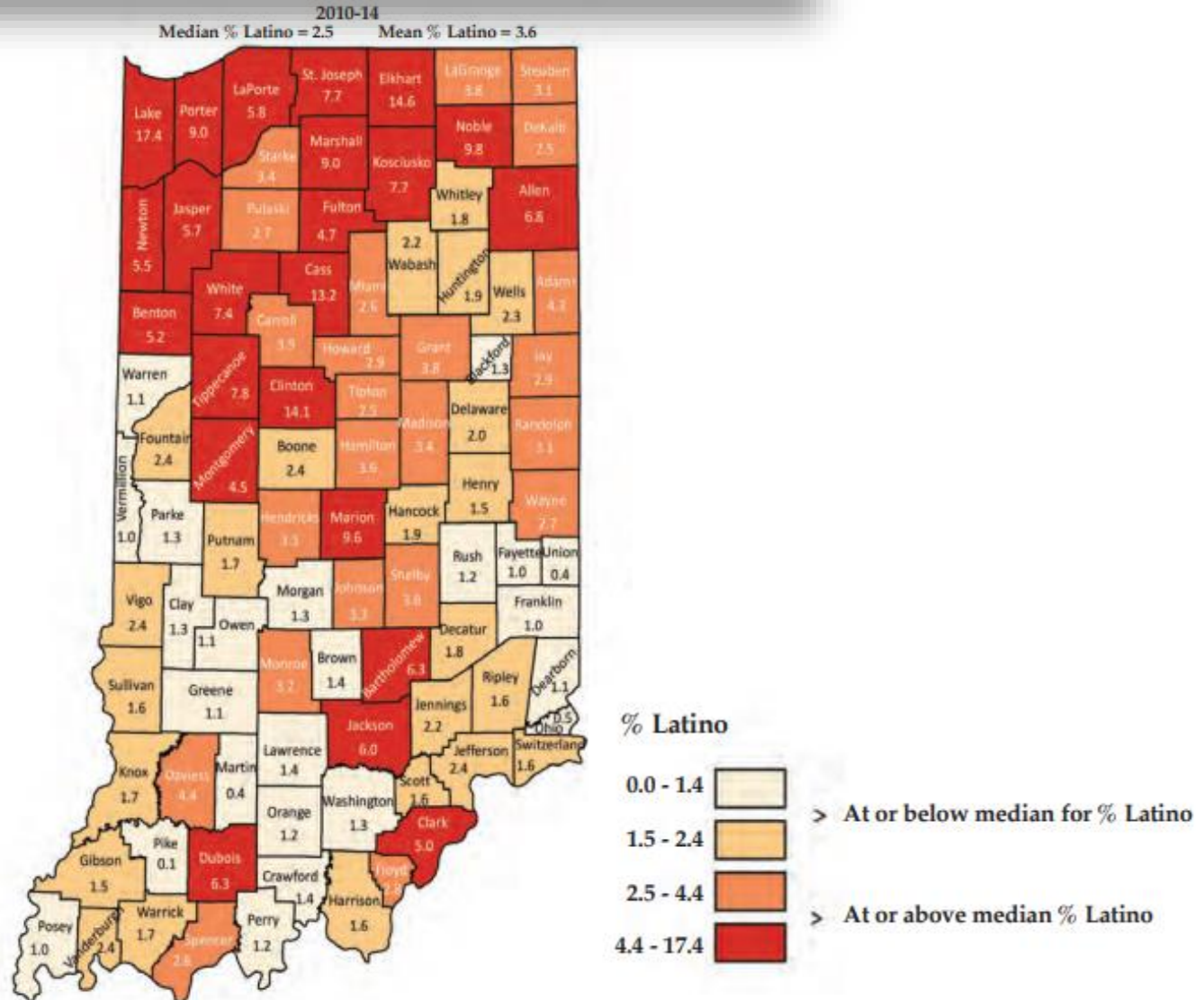

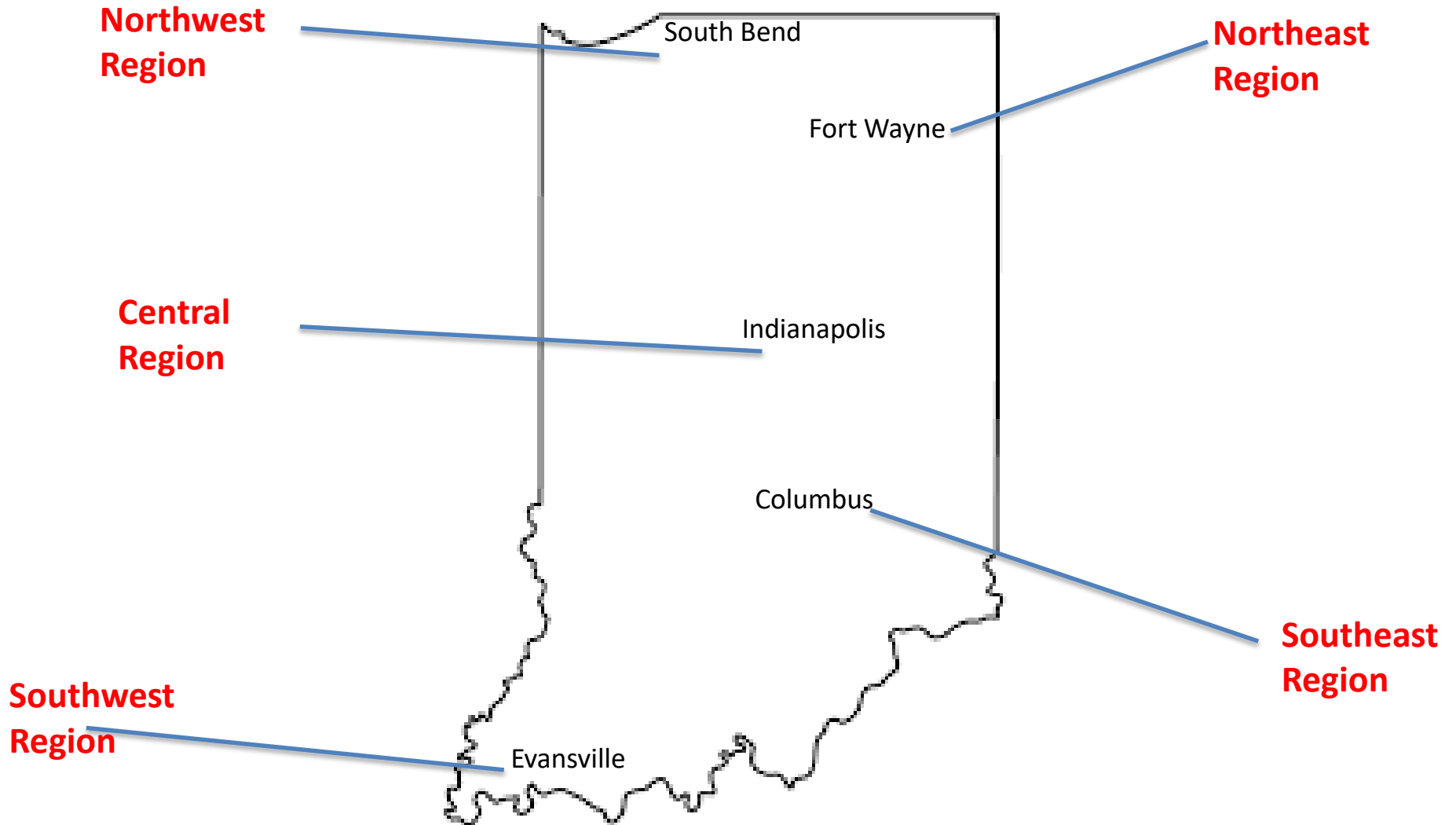
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Indiana's Latino Population (Cont.)
