Survey Dates: April 22-23, 2019

Gear: Small Lake Michigan style trap nets: 4 overnight lifts

Summary

Fish Community

- Overall, there were 3,393 Black and White Crappies collected for a catch rate of 848.3 fish/net.




Figure 1. Number of crappie collected by length.

- Black Crappie were slightly more numerous with 1,765 individuals which ranged in length from 5.4 to 16.2 inches (Figure 1).
- Black Crappie ages ranged from 1 to 11. Averaging 6.6, 8.2, and 8.5 inches at ages 2, 3, and 4 years old. Three to six year old fish constituted 84% of total collected.

- A total of 1,628 White Crappies were collected from 5.8 to 15.2 in, but were not aged (Figure 1).
- Eighty percent of both species of crappies were between 7.0 and 9.0 inches.

Highlights

- This was the first targeted crappie survey at Bruce Lake, with catch considerably higher than other local lakes.
- In a 2014 Bruce Lake angler creel survey, crappie were the fourth most targeted species and the second highest species harvested with an estimated 1,699 fish taken, averaging 9.8 inches.
- General fisheries surveys in the 2011 and 2014 indicated inconsistent crappie recruitment, primary driven by a couple strong year classes. This survey had strong year classes in 2013, 2014 and 2015. Similar among surveys, growth slows at age 3.
- In addition to crappies, 16 Muskies ranging from 24.0 to 47.5 inches were sampled with 63% being legal length (36 in.) and longer.
