Annual Report of Indiana Ginseng Dealings:

2021-22 Harvest and Sale Season

There was a total of **2,125 lbs.** and **8 oz.** of wild ginseng certified in Indiana this year and 15 pounds, 7 oz. of cultivated dry ginseng was reported. Of the wild ginseng, 1623 lbs, 14 oz. was dry and 501 lbs, 10 oz. (converted dry) was wet/green. Gross wet/green weight was 1567 lbs. 9 oz.). This season, Indiana had a total of 18 dealers. While the wild portion of Indiana's Ginseng is down, the cultivated, wild simulated and woods grown categories have all seen small to significant growth resulting in weights from 14oz to 15lbs. in the various categories.

Based on comparison between years, 2021 was down in harvest trends as well as in harvest numbers, while roots per pound were significantly higher. We believe this is due to a variety of reasons: the on-going effects of the COVID -19 pandemic; the loss of another high volume dealer (2nd in 2 years), the significantly less number of harvesters now digging and selling compared to before 2020 (measured by several of Indiana's high volume dealers), the ongoing changes in Ginseng Administration which help eliminate duplication by both dealers and administrators alike; and finally, weather conditions because it is appearing in nearly all counties, but we have not compared the weather officially over the two years. This year was typical in that sales at the beginning of the season were extremely lively and the prices per pound had the same result in that the later in the harvesting or selling season, the higher the price. The average price per pound was \$650.00 at mid-season point (October), which is quite high compared to other years.

FINDINGS:

Present abundance of wild ginseng rating was based on this scale:

0 = Absent	No Activity
1 = Rare	Under 1 lb.
3 = Frequent	Over 1 lb.

At the end of the 2021 harvest season, 18 Indiana counties reported no activity; of these, 9 reported a decrease from last year; 34 counties show an increase in harvest but not enough to move to the next category, 39 counties show a decrease but not enough to move to the next category and only 1 had a drop significant enough to show a trend. Again, most (80) counties reported a harvest which remained relatively steady.

Trend data requested in wild ginseng population considers the comparison of the 2020 harvest season and this current 2021 season:

-2 = extirpated	0 lbs. of wild ginseng harvested 2 years in a row
-1 = decreasing	decrease of more than 50 lbs. of wild ginseng since previous year h
0 = stable	within 50 lbs. of previous harvest of wild ginseng
+1 = increasing	50 or more lbs. of wild ginseng harvested over last season

None of Indiana's 92 counties reported a positive trend in harvest while 8 showed a negative trend, the balance of the counties showed a stable harvest. This year, eleven counties are showing extirpation. While this would seem concerning, at this time, again only four are showing extirpation for a longer period: Adams, Howard, Lake, and Randolph.

This year's root count was up significantly at 381 roots per pound from last year's 276. This was taken from four samples in all areas of Indiana. Although Indiana generally produces smaller high-quality root for apothecary use and not the larger boutique roots used for expensive gifting, the 2021 root count increased enough this year to illustrate weather conditions were not favorable. The smaller roots illustrate that stress on the plants.

Growing conditions continue to be the driving force behind the harvest figures, not the species abundance. We do recommend continuing the harvest under the current rules and regulations and in May 2022, the rules for Ginseng in Indiana were readopted with no changes. However, to help ensure those who violate Ginseng laws in other states are not able to do similar business with similar violations in Indiana, we strongly recommend the adoption of reciprocal suspension among the 19 Ginseng states, such as is already in place for hunting and fishing licenses.

With the 2020 season, the Indiana Ginseng Coordinator, in collaboration with members of IDNR Law Enforcement, IDNR MIS, and IDNR Nature Preserves staff, initiated a complete revamp of the program's administration. Indiana's Ginseng Dealers were required to accomplish 100% of their submittals online and into a database. This was accomplished via various platform (mobile/smartphone, notebook, laptop or desktop computer) and the database behind it allows for single entry accomplished directly by dealers. Various reports, all certificates, annual reporting, etc. are pulled from the logged transactions, verified, electronically signed by dealers and certified by conservation officers online. All is accomplished within current USFWS and Indiana Ginseng laws, rules and regulations. Moreover, the addition of an administration side of the portal has allowed both the ginseng coordinator and conservation officers to review current data (within seconds of its entry) in the enforcement of Indiana's ginseng laws, rules and regulations. For the 21-22 season, dealers were required to use the Ginseng Portal for the second year in a row. Improvements to the system continued as a result of dealer, administration and LE officer feedback. Both license applications and payments were accomplished online opening August 15 and closing COB August 28, 2021. This allowed a couple of days for problems with the system to be corrected and then licenses were issued on August 31, 2021, electronically. Another enhancement to the Ginseng Portal in 2021 allows for intrastate transactions from dealer to dealer and a certificate issued only by the purchasing dealer when the out-of-state/exporting sale is accomplished. This is a much easier transfer for both the selling and buying dealers alike. Most importantly, it eliminates the duplication previously associated specifically with this portion of the system.

Improvements outside the Ginseng Portal included the continued revamp of the Indiana Ginseng website to be a much more user-friendly resource to both the average citizen and anyone who may be in the Ginseng business. It includes general information, history and ecology, updated images, links to forms, etc. Several links were broken and subsequently repaired due to the revamp of the USFWS website. A new poster/handout was produced to specifically highlight the requirement regarding landowner permission. This was distributed via email and website to make them accessible for printing by dealers in order to give to harvesters.

Looking forward to the 2022 season, we will continue to tweak the Ginseng Portal and make it easier to use. Other than that, while no significant developments are planned, we will begin to review Indiana law and rules for conformity to other licensing practices in the state. Part of this will include a review of the ginseng dealer license cost and consideration of a harvester license. Several rules may be considered for modification to follow norms established by Indiana's Fish and Wildlife division for ease of enforcement. Collaborative work will continue between Nature Preserves, Law Enforcement, Fish and Wildlife and others.

In conclusion, there are several factors influencing the lower harvest totals this year. Those include weather, the on-going effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, the second year of the Ginseng portal system including a rather significant removal of duplication, lower numbers of harvesters in general and for the second year in a row, the loss of a high-volume dealer in a key area of the state.
