ESSER-GEER Dashboard Release Notes

Release: May 2022

General Notes:

- Allocations and reimbursements are shown on the dashboard for local educational agencies (LEAs) only. Some funding sources allowed allocations to other entity types such as higher education institutions or non-profits. Allocations and reimbursements for non-LEAs are not included on the dashboard.
- Reimbursement data shown on the dashboard are based on reimbursement requests that have been received and processed by the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) to date. Reimbursement does not equate to expenditure of the grant funds as an LEA must expend funds locally prior to requesting reimbursement.

CARES Act/ESSER 1.0:

- The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) was signed into law on March 27, 2020. The CARES Act contained two funding sources for schools which are included on this dashboard the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER 1.0) and the Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (GEER).
- ESSER 1.0 funds are to be encumbered by September 30, 2022 and liquidated by December 15, 2022.
- Allocations for ESSER 1.0 were required to be delivered on a formula basis to LEAS based upon their proportionate share of the State's total Title I funding allocation.
- In addition to the formula-based allocation, IDOE authorized additional allocations from ESSER 1.0 funds available to IDOE.
- Both the formula-based allocations and the IDOE-authorized allocations are included in an LEA's total allocation for ESSER 1.0 as shown on the dashboard.
- Where applicable, the allocations and reimbursements for an LEA includes the equitable share for non-public schools that is administered through the LEA.

- In addition to the allocations included in the dashboard, IDOE has utilized ESSER 1.0 funding for two grant programs: Digital Learning Grant and Tutoring Fellowship Grant. ESSER 2.0:

- The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA) was signed into law on December 27, 2020. CRRSA authorized a second round of funding for the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER 2.0).
- ESSER 2.0 funds are to be encumbered by September 30, 2023 and liquidated by December 15, 2023.
- Allocations for ESSER 2.0 were required to be delivered on a formula basis to LEAS based upon their proportionate share of the State's total Title I funding allocation.
- In addition to the formula-based allocation, IDOE authorized additional allocations from ESSER 2.0 funds available to IDOE.

- Both the formula-based allocations and the IDOE-authorized allocations are included in an LEA's total allocation for ESSER 2.0 as shown on the dashboard.
- ESSER 2.0 did not contain a requirement for an equitable share for nonpublic schools.

ESSER 3.0:

- The American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act was signed into law on March 11, 2021. ARP authorized a third round of funding for the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER 3.0).
- ESSER 3.0 funds are to be encumbered by September 30, 2024 and liquidated by December 15, 2024.
- Allocations for ESSER 3.0 were required to be delivered on a formula basis to LEAs based upon their proportionate share of the State's total Title I funding allocation.
- In addition to the formula-based allocation, IDOE authorized additional allocations from ESSER 3.0 funds available to IDOE.
- Both the formula-based allocations and the IDOE-authorized allocations are included in an LEA's total allocation for ESSER 3.0 as shown on the dashboard.
- ESSER 3.0 did not contain a requirement for an equitable share for nonpublic schools.

GEER:

- The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) was signed into law on March 27, 2020. The CARES Act contained two funding sources for schools which are included on this dashboard the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER 1.0) and the Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (GEER).
- GEER funds are available for allowable activities occurring through September 30, 2022.
- GEER grants were awarded through a competitive process in two components. Component 1 was available to PK-12 schools and/or institutions of higher education or education-related entities that partnered with one or more PK-12 schools. Component 2 was available to institutions of higher education only.
- The dashboard includes only the awardees from Component 1.
- All awardees in Component 1 have an LEA identified to serve as the fiscal agent for the administration of the GEER grant. The dashboard lists the GEER grant under the LEA serving as fiscal agent. Detailed Dashboard:

- The data in the detailed dashboard has been pulled from the data input by LEAs in the IDOE Title I system. But for certain corrections made by IDOE to the amounts requested on the reimbursement forms, the data displayed has been provided by the LEA.
- While every effort has been made to ensure data consistency across dashboards, it is possible that differences may be displayed. Such differences may be due to timing of data availability and updates, errors and omissions, or other circumstances.
- LEAs can amend budgeted amounts throughout the funding term. Reimbursement requests are not restricted to the amount budgeted as of the date of the reimbursement request. As a result, there may be instances in which an LEAs reimbursement within a particular category or line-item may exceed the amount budgeted for that category or line-item. It is expected that the LEA would modify the budget moving forward to properly reflect the reimbursement amounts.
- Student Enrollment figures represent corporation enrollment for the 2020-2021 school year, as detailed at https://www.in.gov/doe/files/corporation-enrollment-grade-2006-22.xlsx.
- The poverty level percentage shown on the dashboard is based on the formula percentage for the FY21 Title I grant allocation, with exceptions noted below. Title I grant allocations served as a factor in the determination of allocations for ESSER 1.0, 2.0 and 3.0.
 - The poverty level percentages shown for 0935 Borden-Henryville School Corporation and 0945 Silver Creek School Corporation are based on the FY21 formula percentage for West Clark Community Schools, the school corporation that preceded their establishment through a split approved by voters in a referendum in 2020.

- O The poverty level percentage shown on the dashboard for Indiana in total was calculated by totaling the number of formula children ages 5 through 17 for all LEAs with an FY21 Title I allocation and dividing it by the number of children ages 5 through 17 associated with all LEAs with an FY21 Title I allocation.

 - Total Number of Children Ages 5 through 17 for all LEAs with an FY21

 - Poverty Level Percentage for Indiana: 16.5%
- Free and Reduced Lunch Percentage figures represent the percent of students qualifying for free and reduced lunch for the 2020-2021 school year, as detailed at https://www.in.gov/doe/files/corporation-enrollment-ethnicity-free-reduced-price-meal-status-2006-22.xlsx.
- In addition to the ESSER 1.0 allocation, certain school corporations receive and budget for a transfer of ESSER 1.0 funds from other schools. The total budget amount will exceed the total allocation and reimbursement amounts for these schools.
- The Category selection view for the dashboard relates to the budget and reimbursement amounts provided by the LEA by Account Code. The table below identifies the specific accounts contained within each identified category.
