### 2019-2020 Activities:

With the implementation of Indiana Final Rule 410 IAC 39 which incorporated the Indiana Perinatal Transport Standards (October 2018 edition) by reference, the focus of the task force shifted to supporting high quality training and education for Indiana's perinatal transport workforce. The 2019 Perinatal Transport Conference was the fourth statewide conference hosted by the task force. Registrations totaled 115 individuals representing nineteen hospitals.

The focus of the conference was Continuous Quality Improvement. Speakers from the international, National and State world of transport were featured:

Because of COVID-19, the 2020 Perinatal Transport Conference was cancelled. The task force is planning a virtual conference for Spring 2021.

### **Products Developed:**

The Transport Task Force continued to expand the library of education videos to support ongoing professional development on perinatal transport providers. Six videos were developed prior to 2019 and six additional videos were added to the collection through 2020. Topics include the following:

- 30 Years of EMTALA;
- Hypoxic Ischemic Encephalopathy: When to Cool;
- Respiratory Distress of the Neonate;
- Fatigue Mitigation in the Transport Setting; and
- Hypertensive Emergencies.

The IPQIC Transport videos are now being housed on the Indiana Department of Health INTrain platform (<a href="www.train.org/indiana">www.train.org/indiana</a>). Not all videos were able to be converted to the new platform. This new platform will allow transport team members to view the videos at their leisure. While continuing education credits cannot be awarded, individuals will now be able to print a certificate for their personnel file to prove viewership when Levels of Care designation comes around again.



### PERINATAL CENTERS TASK FORCE

### **2019-2020 Activities:**

With the implementation of Indiana Final Rule 410 IAC 39 which established Levels of Care for Indiana's delivering hospitals, the work of the System Implementation Task Force shifted to the implementation of Perinatal Centers as defined in the rules. Hospitals that had expressed interest in gaining designation as a center were invited to participate on a task force to develop shared roles and responsibilities that would support high quality, risk appropriate perinatal care across the state.

The chairs of the System Implementation Task Force were asked to reprise their role as cochairs of the Centers Task Force, not representing their institutions but providing continuity from the System Implementation activity. Each of the hospitals that had expressed an interest in becoming a center were invited to send two representatives to serve on the task force.

Two phases were identified for the task force:

- 1. The development of a guidance document (issues and opportunities) to reduce variability and increase standardization of high-quality care; and
- 2. Once centers were designated, shared responsibility to serve as a practice community/ learning collaborative.

The task force provided input to the Department of Health (DOH) regarding the application to become a center. When the final designation occurred in late 2020, the following hospitals applied for and received designation:

- Ascension St. Vincent Evansville
- Ascension St. Vincent Women's
- Community Hospital North



- Deaconess, The Women's Hospital
- Dupont Hospital
- Riley Children's Health at Indiana University Health Methodist Hospital
- Lutheran Hospital of Indiana
- Memorial Hospital of South Bend
- Parkview Regional Medical Center
- Saint Joseph Health System- Mishawaka Medical Center

### **Products Developed:**

Indiana Administrative Code 410 IAC 39-8 identified the regulatory requirements of a perinatal center but did not address the implementation challenges that may occur. With the goal of improving outcomes for mothers and babies, the need to standardize expectations, support implementation efforts and reduce variability across the state was identified as an initial deliverable. The *Perinatal Centers Guidelines* document was developed by the Centers Task Force to address the implementation challenges. The guidelines address three specific regulatory areas of responsibility:

- Quality Assurance;
- Education; and
- Developmental Follow-up.

The guidelines will be reviewed on an ongoing basis as implementation of Centers and Affiliates proceeds and issues are identified that need to be addressed.

**Task Force Members:** Over 100 health care professionals representing 20 hospitals and organizations.

### **2019-2020 Activities:**

In early 2019, the Governing Council approved the five-year action plan developed by the task force that identified three specific phases of reproductive planning:

- Pre-Childbearing and Adolescent;
- Childbearing; and
- Post Childbearing

The Governing Council asked that the task force review the three phases of reproductive health and explore additional research/activities that could speak specifically to disparities.

The work of the task force focused on implementation of components of the action plan through 2019-2020. Several tools were supported by the task force to address pregnancy intention. Physician task force members prepared presentations for various audiences regarding pregnancy intention. The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted the ability for formal presentations and the task force is looking for alternative opportunities.

The Maternal Hemorrhage Toolkit was launched in 2019 as Indiana's first AIM bundle and has been well received by Indiana's delivery hospitals (<a href="Maternal hemorrhage toolkit (in.gov">Maternal hemorrhage toolkit (in.gov</a>). In 2020, a subgroup began their work on the development of a second AIM bundle focused on Hypertension with the expectation of a launch in early 2021.

The issue of Long-Acting Reversible Contraception (LARC) had been addressed by the task force in 2017 with the development with the development of a toolkit originally designed



to address Medicaid reimbursement for placement at the time of delivery. Data reviewed by the Finance Task Force appeared to indicate that the increase in did not reflect expectations. In 2020, a joint task force of RHP members and Finance Task Force members was established with the goal of identifying all issues that impact postpartum LARC placement.

Finally, after reviewing the original toolkit, the task force established a workgroup to revise the toolkit to develop a more comprehensive approach to LARC. The toolkit will move forward for approval in spring of 2021.

### **Products Developed:**

Two breastfeeding guidance documents were developed by the task force over the last two years:

#### **2019-2020** Activities:

The Perinatal Substance Use (PSU) Task Force continued to focus their efforts on addressing the perinatal substance use issues that challenge Indiana. Building on the work of previous years, the task force held its third annual PSU Statewide Conference in partnership with the Indiana Hospital Association. The goal of the annual conference is to bring the voices and expertise of national and state experts to support the work occurring in Indiana's delivery hospitals. There were two keynote presentations at the 2019 Conference:

By the end of 2020, 60 of the 85 Indiana delivery hospitals have joined the PSU Hospital Collaborative and are screening pregnant women at presentation for delivery using the 5Ps screening tool. These hospitals are also submitting data to the Department of Health to continue to monitor the prevalence of substance exposure in newborns. Quarterly meetings are held to support their efforts and identify challenges and opportunities that can be addressed.

Task Force members also joined a national collaborative hosted by the Association of State and Territory Health Officers (ASTHO) focused on substance use. The Indiana team chose to concentrate their efforts on the implementation of the state statute that requires substance use screening at the first prenatal visit. A new subgroup was established to develop a prenatal screening module to accompany the Perinatal Substance Use Practice Bundle.

In 2020, an additional collaborative was available to Indiana and this activity has become a subgroup of the task force and is focused on the development of a Plan of Safe Care.

### **Products Developed:**

The PSU Hospital Collaborative identified the need for guidance related to the appropriateness of breastfeeding when the mother is using substances. Task Force members joined with representatives of the Reproductive Health Planning Task Force to develop the *Breastfeeding and Substance Use* guidance document.

### **GENETICS AND GENOMICS TASK FORCE**

**Task Force Members:** 18 individuals representing twelve hospitals and organizations along with 10 representatives from the Indiana Department of Health (IDOH).

**2019-2020 Activities:** This task force, established in December of 2018, began its work in earnest in 2019. The task force is charged with ongoing advisement of programmatic practices of the IDOH as they relate to genomic healthcare for perinatal health improvement efforts and fatality prevention. This includes both detection and intervention of pre-pregnancy genetic carrier screening, prenatal genetic testing, newborn genetic screening, birth defects monitoring, and genetic fatality review. With each genetic screen, an action plan for intervention and connection to appropriate healthcare services is needed.

In the two years since its inception, the task force has provided guidance on the pulse oximetry statutory language and recommended changes in state law which occurred in the 2020 session. The implementation of SKID and SMA conditions in the newborn screening panel was successfully launched in July 2020. In the 2020 legislative session, x-ALD was added with an implementation date of July 2021.

Two sub-groups were established in 2020:

- Newborn Screening: The sub-group was charged to develop a standardized process for how Indiana would consider adding a condition to newborn screening. A standardized process supports informed decision-making based on evidence and not emotion. State staff researched the process used by other states and will be helpful in identifying a process for Indiana.
- Birth Defects Registry: The sub-group supported Department staff in a review of the current list of diagnoses that are included in the registry. The group has made recommendations of what conditions should remain and which conditions should result in follow-up.

### 2019 - 2020 Activities:

The Finance Task Force was designed differently from other IPQIC task forces in that its responsibility is to take the programmatic recommendations from other task forces and identify mechanisms for funding. The task force does not initiate programmatic interventions but rather is reactive to the work of the other task forces.

The Finance Task Force continued its review of Group Prenatal Care models of delivery and whether there is strong evidence to support such models in terms of cost savings, participant satisfaction, and potential reduction of risk factors for poor birth outcomes. The reason group prenatal care was sent to the Finance Task Force was to determine whether this methodology of prenatal care was a method that could be supported through enhanced Indiana Health Care Program (IHCP) reimbursement. By the end of 2020, the task force felt it was approaching the end of the information gathering process and will be prepared to make final recommendations to the Governing Council in 2021.

Another focus for the two-year time frame was the result of work that had been conducted previously by the Finance Task Force related to Medicaid reimbursement for LARC placement at the time of delivery. Billing for the procedure did not reflect the level of use that was expected. A joint sub-group of the Finance Task Force and the Reproductive Health Planning Task Force was established to better understand if there is a finance issue or programmatic issue that is contributing to the lower-than-expected usage.



### **Products Developed:**

In 2017, the Governing Council approved *The Economic Cost of Perinatal Morbidity*, a document developed by the Finance Task Force. The document focused on the enormous negative impact of perinatal morbidity to both health outcomes and financial expenditures. Human costs are significant, and the financial burden resulting from poor birth outcomes begins at time of delivery and often stretches into adulthood.

In 2020, the Task Force reviewed and updated the document to reflect new research and data. An infographic with the findings was also updated.
