What should you expect?

During this hour-long training, you will gain important knowledge on the following topics:

- Signs and symptoms of overdose
- The overdose reversal drug naloxone
- The administration of naloxone
- Where to obtain naloxone
- Indiana legislation related to naloxone
- Medication-assisted treatment
- Where to find treatment resources

What will you receive at the training?

After completing the training, participants will receive:

- A certificate stating proficiency in naloxone administration
- A number of physical resources, including a naloxone informational brochure, addiction treatment fact sheet and more.
- Information on how and where to obtain a free dose of naloxone
