We have a few different 14 issues. The Director's Report I know is 15 scheduled early on. Deputy Director Posey will 16 be joining us later, and so, that'll be closer to 17 the close of today's meeting --18 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. 19 MS. RYKER: -- as opposed to the 20 beginning. 21 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. All right. 22 So, we'll go ahead and we'll get started. 23

we'll go through our Old Business. This is where I messed up. I was supposed to have -- do you have the copies of Comm. Long's responses?

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you. Thank you very much.

1 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Well, we 2 can still add it for --3 MS. EROMOSELE: Yes. CHAIRPERSON SLASH: -- the record; 4 5 correct? Okay. MS. RYKER: And can we get the ICRC 6 number for that case? Do you have that? 7 I'll go get it. 8 MS. EROMOSELE: MS. RYKER: Can you get it? 9 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Yes, I do not 10 have it. So, we can -- do you want to cover this 11 at the end, for the record, or would you like to 12 do it now? 13 14 MS. RYKER: We can cover it at the 15 end. MS. EROMOSELE: 16 Okay. CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. All right. 17 And so, for the record, the case of Carolyn King 18 versus Maple Creek Village Apartments we will 19 20 revisit once we figure out who it was actually assigned to and get the information on that one. 21 And we will, at the end of this meeting, come 22 23 back to the case of Donevette Evans versus

Okay. All right. Moving along to New Business, we have one case to assign, and I'll do what I did last month, in which we just had one, we'll come across this way. Would you mind taking it?

COMM. EDWARDS: I can take it.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. So, we will assign the case of Mark Zak versus Lowes to Comm. Edwards.

Okay. And so, we have a hefty list of ALJ Orders to be reviewed today. Would you like to walk us through those?

MS. RYKER: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay.

MS. RYKER: So, there are five separate orders that need to be reviewed by the Commission. As the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act states, this Commission is the final authority for this agency, and so it alone has the ability to either affirm, revise or deny the proposed order issued by, in this case, Administrative Law Judge Burkhardt, who was the

former Administrative Law Judge.

The first two orders that appear, that would be ICRC (Jillian Phillips) versus DePauw University, and then that same case appears as no. 2 on our agenda. Although these are separate orders, they really come together for the purposes of review.

The very first order was a denial of the notice of election that Respondent had put into the record by reason of failing to serve the aggrieved person. And I will disclose at this time that I am the counsel on this case, so as far as the parties agreeing via stipulation that notice was valid, myself, I signed that record, and then presented it for Complainant, Director Gregory Wilson, in this matter.

At this time, I would like to note that opposing counsel is also here to support these motions, and the central issue is what forum these cases should proceed in, whether they should stay before the Administrative Law Judge or be moved to State Court.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Uh-huh.

MS. RYKER: The second order that was issued by Administrative Law Judge Burkhardt was a denial of that stipulation, or the agreement that the parties entered into, stating that the notice of election was valid. He entered that denial primarily because he felt the subject matter was inappropriate, particularly with respect to extending the deadline for the Commission to file in the State Court.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay.

MS. RYKER: I will note that the motion to reconsider does accurately state that Complainant was still able to file in State Court without having to actually use that extension that raised that cause for concern in the initial stipulation.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: So, as I'm understanding this correctly, with both -- with both 1 and 2 --

MS. RYKER: Uh-huh.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: -- that both parties are agreeing to the same thing --

MS. RYKER: Correct.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: 2 Okay. MS. RYKER: And feel free to jump in, 3 4 unless --5 MR. RABINOWITCH: Yes --6 MS. RYKER: -- you agree. MR. RABINOWITCH: -- that's correct. 7 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Thank you. 8 And so, are there any questions by any of 9 the Commissioners for further clarity? 10 COMM. BLACKBURN: 11 COMM. EDWARDS: No. 12 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. So, with 13 that being stated and with both parties 14 requesting the same thing, I move -- or I would 15 like to receive a motion that we uphold the 16 17 request. So moved. COMM. EDWARDS: 18 19 COMM. BLACKBURN: Second. COMM. HARRINGTON: Second. 20 MS. RYKER: Thank you. So, in this 21 particular set of circumstances, as there is no 22 Administrative Law Judge in the office, would it 23

be appropriate for me to propose some language 1 for a revised order for the Commission to sign? 2 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Correct, yes, 3 4 please. Thank you very much. 5 MS. RYKER: CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you. 6 7 Going on to No. 3. MS. RYKER: No. 3 is Administrative 8 Law Judge Burkhardt issued a decision after a 9 hearing in Ky'Alla Williams versus School City of 10 Mishawaka. In this case, there have been no 11 objections filed by either party, so the 12 Commission can either raise an objection on its 13 own or can affirm the Administrative Law Judge's 14 15 opinion. CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Are there any 16 questions by any other Commissioners? 17 (No response.) 18 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Hearing 19 none, I'll accept a motion to affirm the ALJ's --20 21 was it an order? MS. RYKER: (Nodded head yes.) 22 23 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay.

COMM. EDWARDS: So moved.

COMM. BLACKBURN: Second.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Thank you.

MS. RYKER: I'll note for the record that that has been affirmed.

The fourth issue is Lawrence Key versus

Campangna Academy, Inc. This, again, is arising
out of the hearing that was conducted by

Administrative Law Judge Burkhardt. In this
case, Complainant has filed objections, and at
this time is requesting that the Commission set a
deadline for submitting briefs and for oral
argument.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. To my understanding, in past when we've done so, we have granted 30 days for briefs and around 60 days for argument.

MS. RYKER: Correct.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Would that be -- are there any questions or other recommendations on behalf of other Commissioners?

COMM. EDWARDS: No.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: So, feel free to

1 make that --MS. RYKER: (Nodded head yes.) 2 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okav. 3 accept a motion on those same lines. 4 COMM. EDWARDS: So moved. 5 COMM. BLACKBURN: Second. 6 MS. RYKER: So, the deadlines, then, 7 would be a -- 30 days from today --8 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Uh-huh. 9 MS. RYKER: -- for briefing, and then 10 oral arguments to occur in two Commission 11 meetings from now? 12 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Correct. That 13 14 sounds good to me. MS. RYKER: It is the same set of 15 circumstances arising with the fifth order, Lynne 16 Farmer versus Evansville Vanderburgh School 17 Corporation. There was a hearing held by 18 Administrative Law Judge Burkhardt. He issued 19 the order, and Complainant has filed objections, 20 and is again requesting a deadline for briefs and 21 oral argument. 22 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Well, I 23 Okay.

guess we can't make one set of recommendations 1 for one and not the other. Would there be any 2 concerns or questions to doing the same for this 3 case as well? 4 COMM. EDWARDS: No questions. We can 5 6 .do the same. 7 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. accept a motion. 8 We need a motion; right? 9 MS. RYKER: (Nodded head yes.) 10 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. 11 COMM. EDWARDS: I move that we do the 12 same for No. 5 that we did for No. 4. Is that 13 appropriate, or should I --14 MS. RYKER: Uh-huh. 15 COMM. EDWARDS: Okay. 16 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: The case is Lynne 17 Farmer versus Evansville Vanderburgh School 18 Corporation, for the record. 19 MS. RYKER: So, with both Lawrence 20 Key and Lynne Farmer, a briefing deadline of 30 21 days from today, and oral arguments to be set at 22 23 the November Commission meeting?

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Uh-huh.

MS. RYKER: The very last new business issue does not require any action on the part of the Commission at today's meeting, but it is something that you need to be aware of. In the ICRC (Emily Torres) versus Creative Approach Realty case, there has been a motion for summary judgment that was filed on behalf of Complainant. Respondent does have the opportunity to enter that reply before any ruling is issued by the Commission, and that deadline is September 30th.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. And you need nothing from us?

MS. RYKER: Nothing from you other than to note it for the record.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Thank you very much.

All right. So, we've made it through most of that. Do we have anyone that's here for public comment today?

(No response.)

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. It doesn't sound like we do. Understanding that Executive

Director Wilson is in transit and/or that he or 1 2 Doneisha Posey will be coming to give remarks, 3 would it be -- would it be right for us to just take a short recess until their arrival? 4 That seems appropriate. 5 MS. RYKER: COMM. EDWARDS: Yes. 6 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. 7 MS. RYKER: And I'll take that time 8 9 to call Deputy Director Posey and see where she 10 is. 11 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Holli, are you on the phone, still? 12 Yes, I'm still COMM. HARRINGTON: 13 14 here. CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. 15 We're going to take a brief recess and await the 16 17 arrival of Deputy Director Posey. Do you want 18 COMM. HARRINGTON: Okay. me just to stay on? I'm going to be in -- I'm 19 20 approaching the parking structure, so --21 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: We can keep our recess until you get inside as well. 22 23 COMM. HARRINGTON: Okay.

Ramos, thanks for joining us on the phone. 10 We have made it through our Old Business 11 as well as our New Business, and an update can be 12 available if you'd like to see following the 13 meeting, if you'd like. But we'll go ahead and 14 hear announcements at this time. 15 MS. RYKER: And do we need to go back 16 through and receive a ruling as to case number --17 18 as to Donevette Evans versus --
