

2023 Energy Assistance Program Summary

The Energy Assistance Program (EAP) is a federally funded program through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). EAP provides a one-time annual benefit that can assist you with the high cost of home energy and can help if you are disconnected or are about to become disconnected.

Indiana households that make 60% of the state median income (60 SMI) or less may qualify for these benefits.

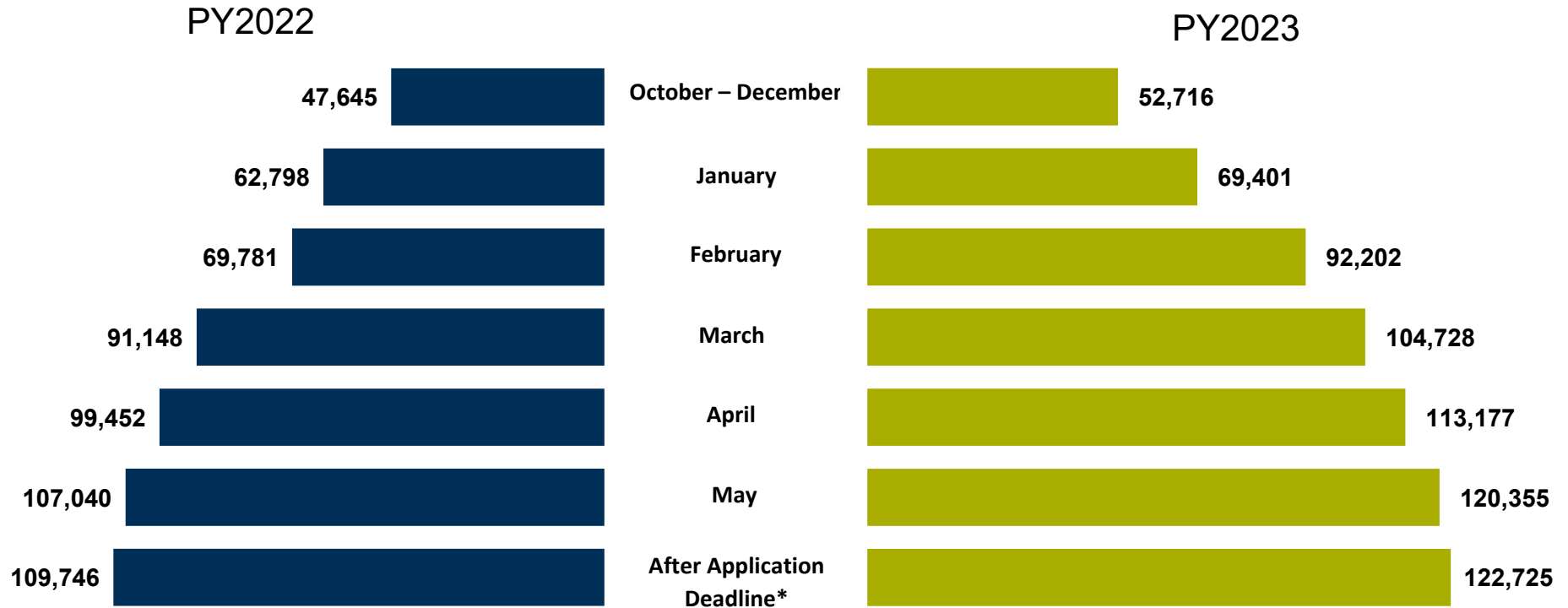
Total EAP Funding for Program Year 2023

EAP Monthly Progress

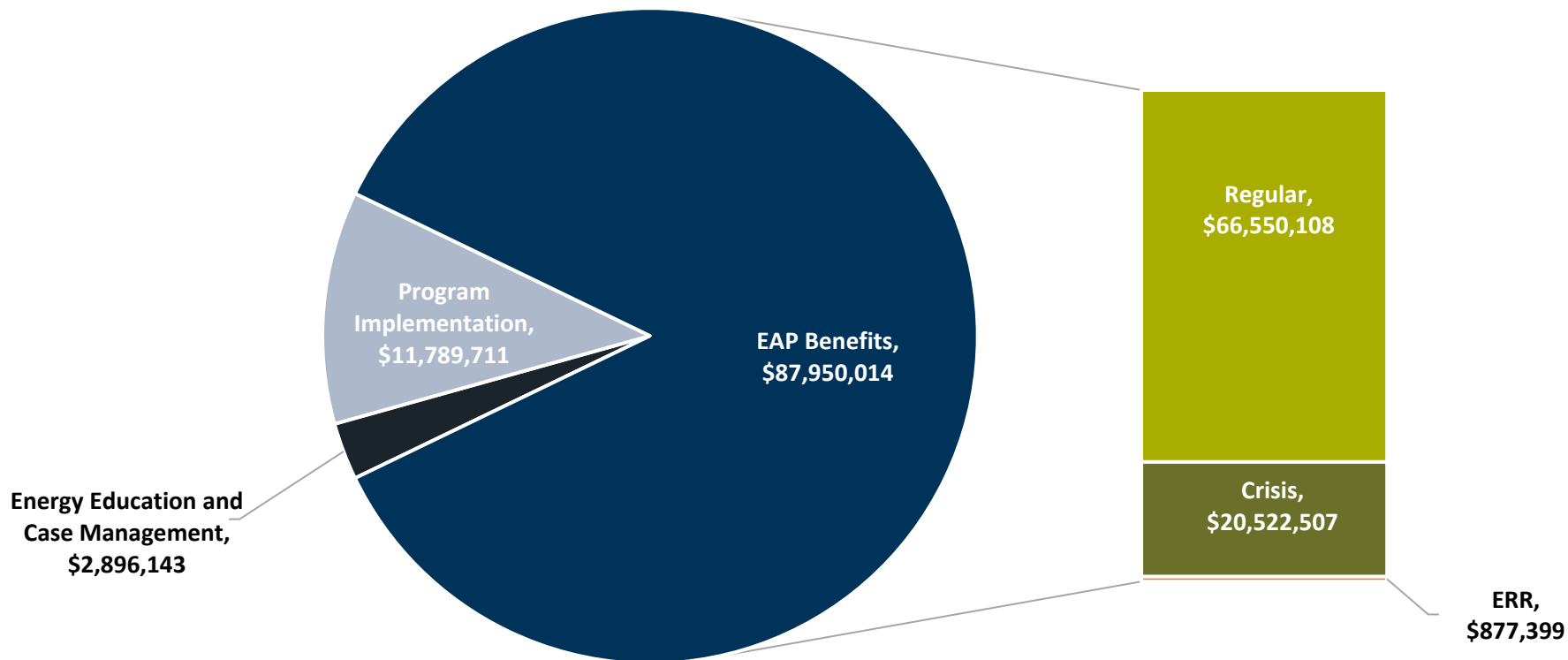

<p>EAP Benefits</p>	<p>Regular Assistance for qualifying households to cover utility bills Crisis Assistance for emergency use to keep or turn on utilities Emergency Repair and Replace to repair or replace faulty utility equipment</p>
<p>Program Implementation</p>	<p>funds include administration and outreach funds for the implementation of assistance every year.</p>
<p>Energy Education and Case Management</p>	<p>funds are provided through Assurance 16 (A16) and can be used for energy education and case management for families and communities.</p>
