

2017 Year In Review



ISDA developed ten GIS Story Maps applications for the major river and Great Lake basins in Indiana to showcase the efforts to enhance water quality.



Clean Water Indiana awarded 16 competitive grants in the 2017 grant cycle. These proposals represented 34 SWCDs and totaled \$938,651.

INfield Advantage has 35 active groups and sampled nearly 1,100 field totaling over 70,000 acres.



CREP planted an estimated 743,201 trees in bottomland floodplain areas and leveraged new funding.

Spring 2017 transects showed more than 3.8 million acres of no-till implementation in corn and soybean fields.



The SSCB standardized CWI grant and reporting procedures for non-SWCD led projects.
