Four Libraries Receive Indiana Authors Award Grants

Indiana Authors Award

The hometown libraries of the three Indiana authors recently awarded the 2011 Eugene &

Marilyn Glick Indiana Authors Award will soon receive \$1,000-\$2,500 in grants. The Award, a program of The Indianapolis Public Library Foundation, and the subsequent grants seek to recognize the contributions of Indiana authors to the literary landscape in Indiana and across the nation. The Award recognition and grants to the following libraries are funded by the generosity of The Glick Fund, a fund of the Central Indiana Community Foundation:

- National Author Winner Margaret McMullan chose the Evansville Vanderburgh Public Library (\$1,500) and Willard Library's Children's Services Program (\$1,000);
- Regional Author Winner Helen Frost chose the Allen County Public Library (\$2,500); and
- Emerging Author Winner Micah Ling named the Franklin Branch of the Johnson County Public Library as her grant recipient (\$2,500).

Public nominations for the award were submitted from across the state earlier this year and eligibility included any published writer who was born in Indiana or has lived in Indiana for at least five years. 
