Thirty-Eight Libraries Awarded LSTA Technology Sub-Grants

Nearly \$325,000 in LSTA Technology sub-grants has been awarded to 38

Indiana libraries. Overall, forty-six

libraries applied for the grants,

requesting \$387,265 in grant funds.

Grants were distributed between 29 public libraries, three academic libraries and six school media centers.

The 2011 LSTA Technology grants will fund the purchase of public access computers, mobile laptop labs, accessibility equipment, microform machines, eReaders and iPads. The grants will also continue to aid public libraries working to meet technology requirements in the new public library standards. The applications were reviewed by members of the Indiana State Library Advisory Council and State Library staff.

Applications for grant opportunities with rolling deadlines (Innovative Library Technology Grant & Information Access for the Unserved Grant) are accepted year round. A new national report shows that Public Library Funding & U.S. public libraries continue to Technology Access Study expand as technology centers for communities, providing essential

However, budget cuts have forced libraries across the country to scale back drastically on operating hours and access to services, just when resources are most needed.

The 2011 Public Library Funding & Technology Access Study reports that virtually all public libraries (99 percent) provide public access to computers and the Internet. More than 87 percent of libraries provide technology training, and more than two-thirds (67 percent) of libraries offer access to e-books, up 12 percent from two years ago.
