Legal History Grants Support Research, Educational Projects

Indiana Humanities has again partnered with the Indiana Supreme Court to offer Indiana Legal History Grants. These grants support research, documentation and educational projects related to Indiana's legal history. Indiana Legal History Grants support research, documentation and educational projects related to Indiana's legal history. Nonprofit organizations, educational institutions and local government agencies may apply for grants of up to \$2,000. Eligible projects include research on court documents, written and oral histories of Indiana's courthouses, cases brought before the courts and histories of individuals and families involved with Indiana's legal system. Proposals for educational print materials are encouraged. These could include walking tour brochures, guides to courthouses and curriculum units designed for K-12 classes. The deadline to apply is December 1, 2011.
