State Library Releases 2013 Public Library Statistics

The 2013 Public Library Statistics from the 2013 Annual Report were recently released and offer a wealth of information and insights into a variety of categories. Here are a handful of interesting highlights from the data compiled and posted online:



- Approximately 58% of Hoosiers are library cardholders.
- There were 36,914,314 visits to Indiana public libraries last year, a 4% decrease from 2012.
- Indiana libraries circulated 77,559,553 items in 2013, a .14% decrease from 2012.
- The number of eBooks available to Hoosiers increased by 201%.
- Children's materials comprised 30% of all materials checked out, and children's programming saw a 2% increase in attendance last year.
- Total program attendance increased by over 10%.
- The number of ALA MLS librarians employed in Indiana public libraries increased by 2% to 950.

The Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) is seeking library input on future grant directions and will host three webinars for stakeholders interested in shaping their communities to maximize educational and economic opportunities. The first of the



webinars will be convened on Tuesday, April 29, from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. EDT at the New York Public Library to discuss the National Digital Platform with U.S. Archivist David Ferriero and other experts at the New York Public Library.

IMLS invites broad participation via a live webcast and library professionals and the public are encouraged to participate through social media using the Twitter hashtag #imlsfocus. During the webinar, library and archive leaders will discuss key needs, gaps, opportunities, and goals to consider in furthering national digital initiatives. Click here for a complete agenda.

The next two meetings will be on May 15 on learning spaces in libraries at the San Francisco Public Library and on June 5 on STEM learning at the Chicago Public Library. IMLS will release a revised National Leadership Grant application this summer that will reflect the priorities identified during these meetings.
