

In August, Governor Eric J.
Holcomb announced the expansion of the Imagination Library of Indiana's statewide book-gifting program. The goal of the expansion is to make books available to children ages 0-5 in every zip code in Indiana. Since the statewide launch, 16 new programs have been established bringing the total to 70 counties. The program is serving 89,278 children. The program will soon be available to more children

This award encourages undergraduate research in a broad range of subjects related to Indiana and the Midwest, and rewards excellence in history research and writing. Many aspects of the region's past, especially related to the history of women, minorities, refugees, peace and social justice issues and the environment, have received limited attention in the historiography. The purpose of this competition is to recognize students who examine these topics and produce scholarship that advances our knowledge of these understudied areas of Indiana and midwestern history.

Entries may be submitted by those who are currently enrolled as undergraduate students and by those who are no more than 12 months beyond college graduation by the due date. The student does not need to be a declared history major, but preference will be given

Monument, has been decorated for Christmas since 1945, prompted by noted Indianapolis architect, Edward D. Pierre. Decorations included Christmas trees, a nativity scene, festive signage, lights, garland and even Santa's warehouse over the years.

In 1962, the Monument was first decorated with vertical cables of lights running from its base to Victory at the apex and was called the "world's largest Christmas tree." The lighting ceremony drew approximately 10,000 people and in 1963, cost about \$10,000. The lighting of the "tree" now regularly occurs the day after Thanksgiving each year.

There are 52 strands of lighted garland put up by around 200 volunteer electricians from the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) #481. The electricians work alternating north to south, erecting each strand to protect the structural integrity of the monument. Installation of the

On Thursday, Jan. 25, 2024, from 10:30-11:30 a.m. the Indiana State Library will present "Getting READy to Build Better School Partnerships." This free webinar will highlight the SB READy program and school partnerships.

"A Matter of Balance" aims to empower participants to reduce the fear of falling and adopt simple yet effective exercises that can be easily incorporated into their daily routines to maintain balance as they age.
