

Indiana's State Agency Databases



With the plethora of information available on the internet, it can be difficult to sort out "the best" from all "the rest." The official website of the State of Indiana, www.in.gov, provides various ways to search or link to government information on state agency pages. But how will you know to look for official sources of information if you don't know that a specialized database or resource even exists? Let's take a moment to highlight some useful resources maintained by Indiana state agencies.

- The Indiana Secretary of State <u>Securities Division</u> provides <u>links to</u> <u>databases</u> you can use to check the licensing and registration of individuals and/or firms in the financial services industry.
- Search the INBiz database for business entities and documents about Indiana public businesses that are registered with the Indiana Secretary of State Business Services Division.
- For both historical and current information about sites, buildings, bridges, and cemeteries

On July 12, 2016 at the Oaklyn
Branch Library, 3001 Oaklyn Drive,
the Evansville Mayor Lloyd
Winnecke took the National Wildlife
Federation's Mayors' Monarch
Pledge, committing to help the
monarch and other pollinators. This
new, national campaign will work
with mayors and local government
chief executives to help save the
declining monarch butterfly.

The Oaklyn Branch Library Meadow offers a unique educational opportunity on pollinators and the monarch butterfly. The meadow is planted with native wildflowers and prairie grasses similar to those growing in open, sunny areas in Indiana 200 years ago when our state was first founded. These are the same varieties of plants on which monarch butterflies fed and laid their eggs and monarch caterpillars grew and thrived centuries ago. The meadow is rich with native plants that provide nectar-rich blooms over many months, from golden alexander early in the spring through native asters and goldenrod in late fall. Included in the mix of wildflowers are several types of milkweeds, including butterfly weed and common milkweed.

"Mayors and other local government officials play a pivotal role in advancing monarch butterfly conservation in urban and suburban areas," said Collin O'Mara, president and CEO of the National Wildlife Federation. "By working together we can ensure that every American child has a chance to experience majestic monarchs in their backyards and communities."
