Small Business Saturday was a success!



From the main streets in towns like Galesburg, Illinois to 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue, there was strong support for local independent businesses on Small Business Saturday. Shoppers across the nation made a powerful statement with 88 million consumers "Shopping Small" on the day, up 14.9 percent from

just a year ago. This according to the results from the Small Business Saturday Consumer Insights Survey, released today by the <u>National Federation of Independent Business</u> (NFIB) and American Express.
